On January 20, 2021, the mobile clinic vaccinated over 380 residents, adding to the staff and caregivers who already had their first dose. This wave of vaccinations was a major step forward in getting through the COVID-19 pandemic.

Shortly after, the mobile clinic returned to the Villa to administer second doses to all medically-able residents.

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YOUR IMPACT

GREENHOUSE REDESIGN

In late 2019. Ian Adamson enrolled his mother in St. Joseph's Villa's Adult Day Program. His mother's health had been declining in the previous year, and he wanted her to have a way to stay active, social and motivated.

Ian had heard great things about the Villa's Day Program and toured the facility before his mother's arrival to understand all the Villa offers. During his tour, he couldn't help but notice room for improvement.

What was once a greenhouse space now served as the Adult Day Program entrance,



as it was no longer in shape to sustain horticulture. The area lacked insulation and was known to leak in inclement weather. and above all, lacked wheelchair accessibility necessary to allow for independent transportation. This made the space unsuitable for programming.

Ian thought to himself, 'What a beautiful space to not be used. I know we can make this better.' As the owner of Greenbelt Greenhouse and an expert in greenhouse design and innovation, he looked no further than himself to make an impact.



After approaching the Villa & Foundation about improving the space, Ian reached out to his team and suppliers to help reimagine the greenhouse. With all on board, they set out to make the space more accessible, safe and comfortable for the Day Program. Ian's initiative inspired the Brabant Foundation, which contributed to this project by providing funds for automatic sliding doors making the space that much more accessible.

It is through these philanthropic efforts, hundreds of clients and their families can enjoy this new and improved program space.



As we envision what St. Joseph's Villa's future looks like with the expansion of the campus, we remain focused on serving the dynamic needs of our long-term care residents.

This past year, the Dougher Community Fund at Hamilton Community Foundation provided funding for an important addition to the campus with the development of a paved pedestrian walkway. The walkway provides safe access as you navigate throughout the campus.

With increased traffic on our growing campus, our residents' safety is of the utmost importance to us. Our walkway is lined with steel railings and has been carefully designed to protect our residents from any potential dangers.

KEEPING CONNECTED WITH TECHNOLOGY

In a year where staying connected is more important than ever, we are so grateful to have community support that makes keeping up with technological advancements possible. Throughout the pandemic, we have seen generous gifts of both iPads and Epson smart boards for our residents to keep connected with their loved ones.

With a grant from Hamilton Community Foundation supporting senior quality of life, smart boards have been installed into resident home areas across the Villa and are greatly beneficial to the health and wellbeing of our residents. Smart boards and iPads can help reduce social isolation by providing interactive, educational and social engagement and activities, as well as video-call, live streaming of events and instant messaging.

The integration of these devices into person-centred care allows the Villa to better meet the unique and diverse needs, interests and choices of each resident, and provide them with a quality of life they are excited about.

ROTARY's 50/50 FOR HOSPICE

In 2018, Dundas Valley Sunrise Rotary Club (DVSRC) committed to supporting the vision of building a state-of-the-art hospice on the Villa's grounds. Faced with COVID-19 restrictions, the rotary club got creative to not only meet but **exceed** their three-year pledge.

The club engaged the community by hosting a 50/50 draw, promoting ticket sales entirely on social media and word of mouth. The raffle exceeded all expectations, selling out quickly and created a sense of excitement that was all so rare throughout the pandemic.

SPA BATHTUB REPLACEMENT


St. Joseph's Villa is a long-term care leader in providing not only compassionate care for residents, but also providing a comfortable atmosphere promoting mindfulness and wellness. A key feature of this focus is bath therapy.

The Villa has been equipped with a number of hydraulic spa bath tubs that have proven to benefit the quality of

life and care for residents. But over time, a number of these bathtubs have needed replacement. Though they directly impact the lives of residents, the Ministry of Health & Long-Term Care does not provide capital funding to support such critical items and equipment.

Thanks to the continued support from Royal Canadian Legion Branch 36 Poppy Fund, the Villa fulfilled a complete replacement of all outdated tubs with brand new hydraulic spa tubs. Our residents can enjoy the soothing comfort vital to their mental health, pain management, mobility and infection prevention, and prevent potential injury to both residents and staff from lifting.
