FINANCIAL SUMMARY


The Foundation achieved strong financial results in 2024-2025, driven by sustained donor engagement, successful fundraising events, and solid investment performance.

St. Joseph's Villa Foundation remains committed to strong financial stewardship and transparency. In 2024-2025, the generosity of our donors, event participants, and community partners enabled major capital improvements at St. Joseph's Villa and capital, programming and operations at Margaret's Place Hospice.

SOURCES OF FUNDS

Donations, grants and bequests accounted for 61% of total revenue, which included:

- Over \$250,000 in Grants
- Almost \$350,000 in tribute Gifts
- Over \$1,000,000 in Major Gifts





FINANCIAL POSITION

The Foundation ended the fiscal year in a strong position. With continued donor support and prudent management, the Foundation is well positioned to fund upcoming priorities in resident care, hospice operations, and capital renewal.

USES OF FUNDS



PERFORMANCE HIGHLIGHTS

- Invested over \$685,000 in Villa capital projects, including safety equipment and facility upgrades.
- Directed almost \$1.0 million for hospice operations and debt
- Allocated \$1.0 million to long-term investment reserves to support future priorities
- Delivered strong donor retention and event participation, maintaining consistent year-over-year fundraising performance.

OUTLOOK

The Foundation entered 2025–2026 with a strong cash position, manageable liabilities, and a clear funding strategy aligned to upcoming capital needs and hospice sustainability goals. Fiscal discipline, diversified revenue streams, and transparent reporting will continue to guide our approach.

AT ST. JOSEPH'S VILLA

- Upgraded kitchen equipment, including a new self-cleaning stove, soup kettle, and essential supplies
- Purchased new hygiene chairs and a new bathtub to improve care and comfort
- Supported music therapy programs that bring connection and joy to residents
- Installed new entryway doors for the North and South Towers, privacy curtains, and janitor carts
- Began Phase 1 of the new call bell system to enhance safety and communication
- Added a new gazebo, creating a welcoming outdoor space for residents and families




DISBURSEMENTS

AT MARGARET'S PLACE

Margaret's Place operations, consisting of staffing, meals, medical, and facility, cost \$2,710,305 annually. The Ministry of Health funds \$1,571,588, leaving an annual shortfall. St. Joseph's Villa Foundation supports \$878,746 per year or \$241 per bed per day or for hospice operations.

In addition to supporting day-to-day operations, we also helped meet the ongoing equipment and facility needs of Margaret's Place Hospice, helping create a warm, comfortable, and well-resourced environment for residents and families.

- Furnished the 11th hospice room, ensuring every family has a peaceful and private space
- Refreshed staff areas with new furniture, including a couch and fridge for the staffroom
- Purchased a new skylift system and provided staff training to improve safety and mobility support
- Installed an irrigation system to nurture the hospice gardens and create a serene outdoor environment
- Funded 40% of hospice operating costs and covered annual principal and interest payments on the hospice debt
